

2010 CENSUS CAUTIONS FROM THE BETTER BUSINESS BUREAU

- * No matter what is asked, you need only to confirm the number of people residing at your address.
- * BBB advises to be cooperative, but cautious to avoid fraud or identity theft.
- * As 2010 Census begins, 140,000 workers will count every person in the U.S. gathering information about each one, including name, age, gender, race, and other relevant data.
- * Census Workers will have a badge, a handheld device, a Census Bureau canvas bag, and a "Confidentiality Notice."
- * Check badge and ID before answering any questions. Never invite any stranger into your home.
- * The Census Bureau may ask for basic financial information such as your range of salary. It will not ask for your bank account number, credit card number, nor will it solicit donations.
- * You do not have to answer regarding your financial situation.
- * The Census Bureau is not working with ACORN. No ACORN worker should approach you for the U.S. Census Bureau.
- * Eventually the Census Bureau may contact you by phone or mail but **never by e:mail**.
- * Never click on a link or any attachment supposedly from the U.S. Census Bureau.

PROBLEM... SOLUTION

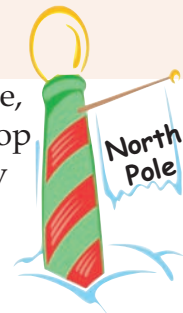
